- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) (1) Not later than 21 days after the end of each calendar quarter, and more
- 18 frequently if so directed by the Comptroller, each licensed wholesaler shall submit
- 19 **COMPLETE AND ACCURATE** information in the form and manner the Comptroller requires
- 20 to facilitate compliance with this [subtitle] TITLE, including a list by brand family of the

- 4 (2) The licensed wholesaler shall maintain and make available to the 5 Comptroller for a period of 5 years all invoices and documentation of sales of all nonparticipating manufacturer cigarettes and any other information relied on in reporting to the Comptroller.
- 8 (b) (1) The Comptroller may disclose to the Attorney General and the 9 Executive Director any information received under this subtitle and requested by the 10 Attorney General or the Executive Director for purposes of determining compliance with 11 and enforcement of the provisions of this [subtitle] TITLE.

- 13 (a) (1) In addition to or instead of any other civil or criminal remedy provided
 14 by law, on a determination that a licensed wholesaler has violated § 16-504(e) or §

 16 Director may revoke or suspend the license of any licensed wholesaler in the manner
 17 provided under §§ 16-211 and 16-212 of this title.
- 18 (2) Each stamp affixed and each offer to sell eigarettes in violation of § 19 16-504(c) of this subtitle shall constitute a separate violation.
- 20 (3) The Executive Director may also impose a civil penalty in an amount 21 not to exceed the greater of 500% of the retail value of the cigarettes sold or \$5,000 on a 22 determination of violation of § 16-504(c) of this subtitle or any regulations adopted under 23 that section.
- 24 (4) (I) IN ADDITION TO OR INSTEAD OF ANY OTHER CIVIL OR
 25 CRIMINAL REMEDY PROVIDED BY LAW, ON A DETERMINATION THAT A LICENSED
