AN ACT concerning
Maryland Community Health Resources Commission – Compensation of Employees <u>and Funding</u>
FOR the purpose of authorizing the Maryland Community Health Resources Commission, in consultation with the Secretary of Health, to set the compensation of certain Commission employees; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management, in consultation with the Secretary of Health, to determine the positions for which the Commission may set compensation; specifying that the Community Health Resources Commission Fund includes money from the Cigarette Restitution Fund, appropriated in a certain manner; and generally relating to the Maryland Community Health Resources Commission and employee compensation.
BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health – General Section 19–2106
