1 AN ACT concerning

2 Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard – Eligible Sources – Alterations 3 (Reclaim Renewable Energy Act of 2023)

FOR the purpose of altering the definitions of "qualifying biomass", "thermal biomass system", and "Tier 1 renewable source" for purposes of excluding energy derived from certain forest-related resources, animal manure, waste, and refuse and gas produced from the anaerobic decomposition of animal waste or poultry waste from being eligible for inclusion in the renewable energy portfolio standard; and generally relating to the renewable energy portfolio standard.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

[(g)] (H) "Offshore wind renewable energy credit" or "OREC" means a renewable energy credit equal to the generation attributes of 1 megawatt-hour of electricity that is derived from offshore wind energy.

attributes of 1 megawatt-hour of electricity that is derived from a Tier 1 renewable source
or a Tier 2 renewable source that is located:

8 (ii) After December 31, 2005, and on or before December 31, 2008, 9 an electricity supplier shall receive 110% credit toward meeting the renewable energy 10 portfolio standard for energy derived from wind.

11 [(3) On or before December 31, 2008, an electricity supplier shall receive 12 110% credit toward meeting the renewable energy portfolio standard for energy derived 13 from methane under § 7–701(r)(4) of this subtitle.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a presently existing obligation
 or contract right may not be impaired in any way by this Act.

16 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all 17 renewable energy portfolio standard compliance years starting on or after January 1, 2023.

18 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2023.
