A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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School-Based Health Centers - Services, Infrastructure, and Funding

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program to provide coverage for sports physicals performed by school-based health centers; requiring the Secretary of Health to include certain infrastructure needs in guidelines on the expansion of school-based health centers; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, on or before a certain date, to develop a certain school-based health center funding allocation formula and a certain budget proposal; and generally relating to school-based health centers.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



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Article – Health – General

- 3 (a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance 4 Program.
- 5 (2) The Program:
- 6 (xx) Beginning on July 1, 2023, shall provide, subject to federal approval and limitations of the State budget, community violence prevention services in accordance with 15–141.3 of this subtitle; [and]
- 9 (xxi) Beginning on January 1, 2023, shall provide, subject to the 10 limitations of the State budget, and as permitted by federal law, coverage for self-measured 11 blood pressure monitoring for all Program recipients diagnosed with uncontrolled high 12 blood pressure, including:
- 13 1. The provision of validated home blood pressure monitors;
- 14 and
- 15 2. Reimbursement of health care provider and other staff 16 time used for patient training, transmission of blood pressure data, interpretation of blood 17 pressure readings and reporting, and the delivery of co-interventions, including 18 educational materials or classes, behavioral change management, and medication 19 management; AND
- 20 (XXII) BEGINNING ON JANUARY 1, 2024, SHALL PROVIDE, 21 SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THE STATE BUDGET, COVERAGE FOR SPORTS 22 PHYSICALS PERFORMED BY SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS.

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- 24 **(A)** The Secretary, in consultation with the State Department of Education and other stakeholders, shall develop guidelines to support the expansion of school-based health centers.
- 27 (B) THE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION 28 SHALL INCLUDE:
- 29 **(1)** THE INFRASTRUCTURE THAT IS NEEDED FOR SCHOOL-BASED 30 HEALTH CENTERS TO JOIN THE FEDERAL VACCINES FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM. 31 **IMPACT** OF THE **NEEDED** INFRASTRUCTURE INCLUDING THE ON THE INFRASTRUCTURE ON SCHOOLS WITH A SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER; AND 32
 - (2) HOW TO ACCOUNT FOR INFRASTRUCTURE IN SCHOOL

- 1 DEVELOPMENT CONSTRUCTION PLANS THAT IS NEEDED FOR SCHOOLS TO
- 2 ESTABLISH A SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER, INCLUDING THE INFRASTRUCTURE
- 3 NEEDED FOR A SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE FEDERAL
- 4 VACCINES FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM.
- 5 (C) THE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION
- 6 SHALL INCLUDE ESTIMATED COSTS FOR ADDRESSING THE INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS
- 7 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (B)(1) OF THIS SECTION.

- 9 (A) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2024, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP
- 10 A FUNDING ALLOCATION FORMULA FOR SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS THAT
- 11 INCORPORATES:
- 12 (1) MULTI-YEAR OPERATIONAL GRANT FUNDING TO ENABLE
- 13 EXISTING SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS TO PLAN FOR AND TO REDUCE THE
- 14 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS ON SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS AND THE
- 15 **DEPARTMENT**;
- 16 (2) FUNDING TO ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE CONSIDERING OPENING
- 17 SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS;
- 18 (3) BASE FUNDING TO ANY APPROVED SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH
- 19 CENTER SEEKING STATE FUNDING THAT IS BASED ON STAFFING, HOURS OF
- 20 OPERATIONS, AND SERVICES OFFERED; AND
- 21 (4) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ADD-ON
- 22 PAYMENTS FOR THE HIGHEST NEED AREAS AND FOR MEETING QUALITY METRICS,
- 23 INCLUDING INCREASED SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER ENROLLMENT AND
- 24 SERVICE UTILIZATION.

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- 25 (B) (1) THE QUALITY METRICS ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(4)
- 26 OF THIS SECTION MAY USE ANNUAL SURVEY DATA RELATED TO SCHOOL-BASED
- 27 HEALTH CENTERS IN THE STATE TO DETERMINE YEAR-OVER-YEAR CHANGES IN
- 28 ENROLLMENT AND SERVICE UTILIZATION.
- 29 **(2)** THE DEPARTMENT MAY:
- 30 (I) USE ANNUAL SURVEY DATA RELATED TO SCHOOL-BASED
- 31 HEALTH CENTERS TO SET A PERCENT INCREASE IMPROVEMENT TARGET; AND
 - (II) ALLOCATE FUNDING EQUALLY ACROSS ALL SCHOOL-BASED

- 1 HEALTH CENTERS THAT MEET THE IMPROVEMENT TARGET.
- 2 **19–22A–03.**
- ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2024, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP A BUDGET PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE SUFFICIENT FUNDING WITH THE GOAL OF
- 5 ESTABLISHING AT LEAST ONE SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER IN EACH COUNTY.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2023.
