

- [(10)] **(X)** Information about the types of support services available to a student bully or victim and any bystanders.

- 1 (a) On or before September 1, 2023, the State Board of Education shall update 2 the model policy prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation in public schools 3 required under § 7–424.1 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 4 (b) On or before September 1, 2023, each nonpublic school shall update its policy 5 prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation in nonpublic schools required under § 6 7–424.3 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 8 1, 2023.
