

- 17 Notwithstanding subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph and (iii) subsection (a)(4)(i) of this section, if a retiree is an additional employee or agent of the State 18 19 Racing Commission, for the purposes of determining a retiree's State subsidy, creditable 20 service shall be determined with respect to service as an additional employee or agent 21beginning from the initial date of employment.
- 22Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c) of this section and §§ 2–509 and 23 2-509.1 of this subtitle, the State may establish separate health insurance benefit options 24 for retirees that differ from those for active State employees.
- 25Subject to § 2–509.1 of this subtitle, on or after July 1, 2011, the health (2)26insurance benefit option for retirees shall include a prescription drug benefit that:
- 27 has the same co-payments, coinsurance, and deductible that apply to the prescription drug benefit for active State employees; 28
- 29 (ii) requires:

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- 30 1. retirees who qualify for the maximum State subsidy to pay 25% of the premium for the prescription drug benefit; and 31
- 32 2. retirees who qualify for a partial State subsidy to pay 25% 33 of the premium for the prescription drug benefit plus the proportional additional amount 34 required under subsections (b)(4)(ii) and (c)(4)(ii) of this section; and
  - (iii) requires retirees to pay out-of-pocket limits equal to:

- 1. \$1,500 for the retiree only; and
- 2 \$2,000 for the retiree and the retiree's family.
