A BILL ENTITLED

Natural Resources – Submerged Aquatic Vegetation Protection Zones – Aerial Surveys

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "aerial survey" for purposes of certain 5 provisions of law relating to submerged aquatic vegetation protection zones to mean 6 an aerial survey compiled by an entity approved by the Department of Natural 7 Resources, rather than a certain aerial survey compiled by the Virginia Institute of 8 Marine Sciences for certain purposes; altering the frequency with which the 9 Department must update the delineations of submerged aquatic vegetation protection zones; and generally relating to submerged aquatic vegetation protection 10 11 zones.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (2) "Aerial survey" means [the annual] AN aerial survey compiled by [the
- 23 Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences for the annual Bay-wide Submerged Aquatic
- 24 Vegetation Mapping Program AN ENTITY APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.



- "SAV protection zone" means an area delineated by the Department for 1 (3)2 the protection from uprooting and the restoration of submerged aquatic vegetation. 3 (b) [In 2004 and every 3 years] ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1, 2024, AND (1) 4 EACH MARCH 1 thereafter, the Department shall update the delineations of SAV protection zones [that were completed in 2001]. 5 6 The updated delineations shall include areas where submerged aquatic (2)7 vegetation has been mapped by aerial surveys during at least 1 of the previous 3 years. 8 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a previously (c) (1) 9 delineated SAV protection zone may be opened to the use of the gear set forth in subsection 10 (f) of this section during an update if: 11 Aerial surveys have not shown any submerged aquatic (i) 12 vegetation in the area during the past 3 years; or 13 Aerial surveys have shown the density of submerged aquatic (ii) vegetation in that area to be less than 10% during each of the past 6 years. 14 15 The areas in the vicinity of Smith Island, South Marsh Island, and (2)16 Bloodsworth Island that were closed to hydraulic clam dredging in the 1999 delineation 17 shall be closed to the gear set forth in subsection (f) of this section and may not be reopened. To the extent possible, the Department shall adjust SAV protection 18 19 zones so that delineations are geographically manageable, utilizing straight lines and 20 existing points of reference. 21 To the extent possible, an adjustment made in accordance with 22 paragraph (1) of this subsection shall result in no net loss or gain of protected area. 23 To the extent possible, to prevent the net loss or gain of protected 24area resulting from an adjustment made in accordance with paragraph (1) of this 25 subsection, the adjustment may: 26 1. Exclude small areas of vegetated bottom; or 2. 27 Include small areas of unvegetated bottom.
- 28(e) The Department:
- 29 (1) Shall utilize buoys or other visible landmarks as appropriate to mark 30 SAV protection zones;
- May make revisions to the delineations of SAV protection zones at any 31 (2) 32 time if determined to be necessary; and
