

- 1 (iii) Sworn law enforcement officers and court security officers may 2 seek recognition in order to organize and bargain collectively in good faith with the City 3 concerning [merit step increases and those benefits] SALARY, WAGES, HOURS, AND 4 OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT THAT ARE determined, offered, 5 administered, controlled, or managed by the City.
- 6 (iv) 1. A sworn law enforcement officer or a court security officer 7 who is a member of a bargaining unit with an exclusive representative may discuss any 8 matter with the employer without the intervention of the exclusive representative.
- 9 2. If a discussion under subsubparagraph 1 of this subparagraph leads to a resolution or an adjustment of a dispute, the resolution or 11 adjustment may not be inconsistent with the terms of a collective bargaining agreement 12 then in effect.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
