4 FOR the purpose of providing that the Secretary of Higher Education is appointed by, and  $\mathbf{5}$ serves at the pleasure of, the Governor; altering eligibility criteria for, and the 6 process for awards from, the Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Program of Educational 7 Excellence Awards; altering eligibility criteria for services provided to students 8 through the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program; altering the 9 administration of the Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship to require community colleges to award scholarships from the Maryland Community College 1011 Promise Scholarship in place of the Office of Student Financial Assistance within the 12Maryland Higher Education Commission; repealing certain provisions of law related 13 to the intent of the General Assembly for the Commission to be reorganized to 14 establish the Office of Student Financial Assistance as a separate independent agency in a certain fiscal year; and generally relating to the appointment of the 1516Secretary of Higher Education and student financial assistance programs in the 17State.
