Public Safety - Deputy State Fire Marshal - Probationary Status and Promotion

- 1 AN ACT concerning
- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a certain deputy State fire marshal to be on probation for a
- 4 certain period of time under certain circumstances; specifying the pay that a certain
- 5 deputy State fire marshal is entitled to on promotion; and generally relating to
- 6 deputy State fire marshals.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Public Safety
- $15 \quad 2-403.$

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- 16 (a) Each police employee, including an individual who is appointed to the
- 17 Department for training before regular assignment as a police employee, shall remain in
- 18 probationary status for a period of 2 years after the date of appointment to the Department.
- 19 (b) Each civilian employee shall remain in probationary status for the period
- 20 required under Title 7, Subtitle 4 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article.
- 21 (C) EACH DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL, INCLUDING AN INDIVIDUAL WHO 22 IS APPOINTED TO THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL FOR TRAINING



- 1 BEFORE REGULAR ASSIGNMENT AS A DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL, SHALL REMAIN
- 2 IN PROBATIONARY STATUS FOR A PERIOD OF 2 YEARS AFTER THE DATE OF
- 3 APPOINTMENT TO THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL.

- 5 (a) (1) The Secretary shall develop a pay plan for police employees, State
- 6 Police communications operators, and State Police communications supervisors that
- 7 includes the ranks and the grades within ranks that the Secretary considers appropriate.
- 8 (2) The pay plan under this subsection:
- 9 (i) is subject to approval by the Secretary of Budget and
- 10 Management; and
- 11 (ii) is effective on approval by the Governor only to the extent that
- 12 sufficient money is included in the State budget.
- 13 (b) Each police employee, State Police communications operator, and State Police
- 14 communications supervisor is entitled to receive the pay rate, including any increment
- based on length of service, set forth in the pay plan established under subsection (a) of this
- 16 section.
- 17 (c) (1) Each police employee is entitled to the pay rate for the next highest step
- 18 within the police employee's rank on:
- 19 (i) each July 1, if the police employee was a police employee on July
- 20 1, 1967; or
- 21 (ii) each anniversary of the date of employment, for all other police
- 22 employees.
- 23 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, on
- 24 promotion a police employee OR A DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL is entitled to the pay
- 25 specified for the new rank in the same step that the police employee OR DEPUTY STATE
- 26 FIRE MARSHAL occupied before promotion.
- 27 (ii) If the step that the police employee OR DEPUTY STATE FIRE
- 28 MARSHAL occupied before promotion is higher than that held by a police employee OR
- 29 **DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL** who is already in the rank and has equal or higher total
- 30 service time, on promotion the police employee OR DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL is
- 31 entitled only to the pay specified for the new rank in the next lower step than the police
- 32 employee OR DEPUTY STATE FIRE MARSHAL occupied before promotion.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 34 October 1, 2023.
