CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - Youth Camps, Development Organizations, and Programs - Criminal History Records Checks

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to apply to the Criminal 4 Justice Information System Central Repository for criminal history records checks 5 6 for certain youth camp applicants; requiring that the Department issue a written 7 determination to a youth camp as to whether the results of a criminal history check would be the basis for prohibiting the hiring of an applicant within a certain time 8 9 period; repealing the authority of youth development organizations and programs to 10 request from the Department a determination of whether the results of a criminal 11 history records check would prohibit the hiring of a job applicant; and generally 12 relating to youth camps, development organizations, and programs and criminal 13 history records checks.

- 25 (3) THE MANDATORY PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL

- 27 (D) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10–201 THROUGH 10–229 OF THE CRIMINAL

- 3 (1) IS CONFIDENTIAL;
- 4 (2) MAY NOT BE REDISSEMINATED; AND
- 5 (3) MAY BE USED ONLY FOR THE PERSONNEL SCREENING 6 PROCEDURES AUTHORIZED BY THIS SUBTITLE.
- 7 (F) THE SUBJECT OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK UNDER THIS 8 SECTION MAY CONTEST THE CONTENTS OF THE PRINTED STATEMENT ISSUED BY 9 THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AS PROVIDED IN § 10–223 OF THE CRIMINAL 10 PROCEDURE ARTICLE.
- 11 (G) IF CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION IS REPORTED TO THE
 12 CENTRAL REPOSITORY AFTER THE DATE OF THE INITIAL CRIMINAL HISTORY
 13 RECORDS CHECK, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE
 14 DEPARTMENT REVISED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION FOR THE
 15 APPLICANT.

- [(a) In this section, "youth development organization or program" means an organization or a program that provides activities for minors.]
- 19 [(b)] (A) The Department shall:
- 20 (1) Investigate complaints received regarding [the] A youth camp; and
- 21 (2) Require appropriate training, including knowledge of outdoor camping, 22 for a camp inspector.
- [(c)] (B) (1) Before a youth camp [or youth development organization or program] makes a formal offer of employment to a job applicant, the operator of the youth camp [or youth development organization or program] may request from the Department a determination as to whether the results of a [federal] NATIONAL OR STATE criminal history records check would be the basis for prohibiting the hiring of the applicant.
- 28 (2) On WITHIN 3 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER receipt of a request from the operator of a youth camp [or youth development organization or program] under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Department shall issue a written determination to the youth camp [or youth development organization or program] as to whether the results of a [federal] NATIONAL OR STATE criminal history records check would be the basis for prohibiting the hiring of the applicant.
