BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Tax - Property

2 3	(a) The head of the Department is the Director of Assessments and Taxation, who shall be appointed by the Governor.
4 5	(b) [(1)] The Director shall be an individual who has executive ability and who is trained and experienced in the tax field.
6 7	[(2) After reaching the age of 70 years, an individual may not continue to hold the office of Director.]
8 9	(c) Before taking office, the appointee shall take the oath required by Article I, $\S$ 9 of the Maryland Constitution.

11	(a) There is a supervisor for each county.
12 13	(c) (1) In addition to the qualifications set under $\S 2-109$ of this subtitle, a supervisor:
14	(i) may not hold any other public office of profit; AND
15 16 17	(ii) on appointment, need not be a resident of the county for which the supervisor was appointed, but shall become a resident of the county after the appointment is made[; and
18 19	(iii) may not continue to hold office after reaching the age of 70 years].
