(a) In addition to any organization and capitalization fee required under § 1–204 s subtitle, subject to subsection (c) of this section, the Department shall collect the fees fied in subsection (b) of this section.
(b) (6) For a duplicate of a certificate mentioned in paragraph (5) of this ction which is issued at the same time as the original, the fee is \$1, and for a <b>ELECTRONIC</b> copy of any other paper recorded or filed with the Department, the fee per page.
