SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023. \(\frac{1}{2}\) Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2024, Section 1 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
