## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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State Board of Nursing – Peer Advisory Committees, Scopes of Practice, and Licensure Requirements

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Nursing to appoint peer advisory 5 committees to provide advice related to midwifery; authorizing licensed nurses 6 certified as nurse-midwives and licensed certified midwives to personally prepare 7 and dispense a starter dosage of certain drugs under certain circumstances; 8 authorizing licensed nurses certified as nurse-midwives and licensed certified 9 midwives to delegate certain tasks to certified medication technicians and certified nursing assistants under certain circumstances; altering the exceptions to the 10 11 certified midwifery licensure requirement and the qualifications required for a 12 license; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with 13 stakeholders, to develop recommendations to expand access to birthing services in 14 birthing centers; and generally relating to health care practitioners licensed by the State Board of Nursing. 15






