FOR the purpose of requiring each unit of State government to give preference to certain products produced from recycled or organic materials when purchasing compost, mulch, or other soil amendments or recycled aggregate; and generally relating to the

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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17 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 18 INDICATED.

19(2) "AGGREGATE" MEANS GRAVEL, CRUSHED STONE, SAND, AND20OTHER SIMILAR MATERIALS.

- (I) A PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE; AND

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1 (II) ANY OTHER PROVISION THAT FAVORS PRODUCTS 2 PRODUCED FROM RECYCLED OR ORGANIC MATERIALS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS 3 SECTION.

4 [(a)] (B) A State or local unit responsible for the maintenance of public lands in 5 the State, to the maximum extent practicable, shall give consideration and preference to 6 the use of compost in any land maintenance activity that is to be paid for with public funds.

7 [(b)] (C) It is the goal of the Department of General Services to:

8 (1) compost, to the extent practicable, all landscape waste on State 9 property that is under its operation for use as fertilizer in landscaping activities; and

10 (2) increase the percentage of landscaped area fertilized by compost each 11 year.

12 (D) (1) IN PURCHASING COMPOST, MULCH, OR OTHER SOIL AMENDMENTS 13 OR RECYCLED AGGREGATE, EACH UNIT OF STATE GOVERNMENT SHALL GIVE 14 PREFERENCE TO PRODUCTS PRODUCED FROM MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE, FOOD 15 WASTE, SLUDGE, YARD WASTE, CLEAN WOOD WASTE, OR OTHER RECYCLED OR 16 ORGANIC MATERIALS, PROVIDED THAT:

- (I) THE PRODUCTS ARE COMPETITIVELY PRICED; AND

18(II)THE QUALITY OF THE PRODUCTS IS SATISFACTORY FOR THE19INTENDED PURPOSES.

(2) (1) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A
 PRODUCT SHALL BE CONSIDERED TO BE COMPETITIVELY PRICED FOR PURPOSES OF
 THIS SUBSECTION IF THE PRICE OF THE PRODUCT IS NOT MORE THAN 10% ABOVE
 THE PRICE OF A COMPARABLE PRODUCT MANUFACTURED FROM VIRGIN
 MATERIALS.

(II) IF THE MARYLAND GREEN PURCHASING COMMITTEE
DETERMINES THAT A 15% PRICE DIFFERENTIAL IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE
STATE, A PRODUCT MAY BE CONSIDERED TO BE COMPETITIVELY PRICED FOR
PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE PRICE OF THE PRODUCT IS NOT MORE THAN
15% ABOVE THE PRICE OF A COMPARABLE PRODUCT MANUFACTURED FROM VIRGIN
MATERIALS.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 October 1, 2023.
