1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Schools - Cyber Safety Guide - Development, Usage, and Reporting

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health 4 Administration within the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center 5 for School Safety, and the Department of Information Technology jointly to develop 6 and publish a cyber safety guide to be made available in public schools beginning in 7 a certain school year; requiring the cyber safety guide to be developed in consultation 8 with certain professionals; requiring the cyber safety guide to be posted on the 9 websites of the State Department of Education and the Maryland Center for School Safety and distributed to each county board of education; and generally relating to 10 11 the development and usage of a cyber safety guide in public schools.

- 1 (C) THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE SHALL BE:
- 2 (1) POSTED ON THE WEBSITES OF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE 3 MARYLAND CENTER FOR SCHOOL SAFETY; AND
- 4 (2) DISTRIBUTED TO EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL.
- 5 (D) THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE MAY INCORPORATE OTHER STATE, 6 FEDERAL, NONPROFIT, OR PUBLIC RESOURCES.
- 7 (E) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 8 SECTION.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 2024, the
- 10 State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health Administration within the
- 11 Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center for School Safety, and the
- 12 Department of Information Technology jointly shall report to the General Assembly, in
- accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the development and usage
- of the cyber safety guide for students, parents, and teachers.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 16 1, 2023.
