2 Economic Development – Cybersecurity – Cyber Maryland Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Cyber Maryland Program in the Maryland Technology Development Corporation to increase the cybersecurity workforce in the State, build 4 $\mathbf{5}$ an advanced cybersecurity workforce, and carry out other purposes related to the 6 cybersecurity workforce in the State; establishing the Cyber Maryland Fund; 7 establishing the Cyber Maryland Board; requiring the Maryland Higher Education 8 Commission, in consultation with a certain organization, to expand the Cyber 9 Warrior Diversity Program under certain circumstances on or before a certain date 10 each year; repealing the requirement that the Commission allocate certain funds to 11 certain institutions in the Cyber Warrior Diversity Program on a certain basis; 12 establishing requirements related to unexpended funds allocated by the Commission 13under the Cyber Warrior Diversity Program; and generally relating to the Cyber 14 Maryland Program.
