4 FOR the purpose of ~~establishing the Public School Stadium Grant Program; requiring the~~

7 comprehensive study analyzing the current condition of public high school athletic  
8 and physical education facilities in the State; requiring the Prince George’s County  
9 Board of Education and the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning  
10 Commission, on or before a certain date, to meet to discuss potential partnerships to  
11 upgrade public high school athletic and physical education facilities; and generally

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
20 That ~~the Laws of Maryland read as follows:~~

29 (F) ~~THE INTERAGENCY COMMISSION MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS~~  
30 ~~NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.~~

1           (a)   (1)   The Interagency Commission on School Construction shall conduct a  
2 comprehensive study analyzing the current condition of public high school athletic and  
3 physical education facilities in the State.

4           (2)   In conducting the study, the Interagency Commission on School  
5 Construction shall consult with each county board of education.

6           (b)   The study shall include:

7           (1)   subject to subsection (c) of this section, an analysis of public high school  
8 athletic and physical facilities in the State, including information for each public high  
9 school on:

10           (i)   the last time the athletic and physical education facilities were  
11 upgraded;

12           (ii)   whether a partial or full replacement of the athletic and physical  
13 education facilities is needed;

14           (iii)   the estimated cost of a partial or full replacement of the athletic  
15 and physical education facilities; and

16           (iv)   the overall quality of the athletic and physical education  
17 facilities;

18           (2)   the average cost for public high school athletic and physical education  
19 facility replacements;

20           (3)   the total financial need by county for athletic and physical education  
21 facility replacements;

22           (4)   recommendations on best practices for replacing athletic and physical  
23 education facilities; and

24           (5)   an audit of any related needs assessments that have already been  
25 conducted by a county.

26           (c)   A county board shall provide the information required under paragraph (b)(1)  
27 of this section on request from the Interagency Commission on School Construction.

28           (d)   On or before December 1, 2023, the Interagency Commission on School  
29 Construction shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor  
30 and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

31           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1,  
32 2023, the Prince George's County Board of Education and the Maryland-National Capital

1 Park and Planning Commission shall meet to discuss potential partnerships to upgrade  
2 public high school athletic and physical education facilities in Prince George’s County.

3 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
4 June 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2024,  
5 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and  
6 of no further force and effect.
