10 11	(i) the last time the athletic and physical education facilities were upgraded;
12 13	(ii) whether a partial or full replacement of the athletic and physical education facilities is needed;
14 15	(iii) the estimated cost of a partial or full replacement of the athletic and physical education facilities; and
16 17	(iv) the overall quality of the athletic and physical education facilities;
18 19	(2) the average cost for public high school athletic and physical education facility replacements;
20 21	(3) the total financial need by county for athletic and physical education facility replacements;
22 23	(4) recommendations on best practices for replacing athletic and physical education facilities; and
24 25	(5) an audit of any related needs assessments that have already been conducted by a county.
26 27	(c) A county board shall provide the information required under paragraph (b)(1) of this section on request from the Interagency Commission on School Construction.
28 29	(d) On or before December 1, 2023, the Interagency Commission on School Construction shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor
