16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND
17	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) 2 The Department, subject to subsection (c) of this section, shall hire a 3 consultant to conduct an independent evaluation of the State Commission of Real Estate 4 Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors, to determine if the Commission is adhering to the most recent Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal 5 Practice's diversity, equity, and inclusion guidelines in its regulation of real estate 6 appraisers and appraisal management companies in the State. 7 8 The independent evaluation of the Commission required under (c) (1)subsection (b) of this section shall be conducted under the supervision of the Office of 9 10 Program Evaluation and Government Accountability in the Department of Legislative 11 Services, which, in consultation with the Department, may: write the proposal for the hiring of the consultant; 12 (i) 13 (ii) select the consultant; and 14 distribute the evaluation to the committees of jurisdiction, in (iii) 15 accordance with the Maryland Program Evaluation Act. 16 The Department shall pay the costs of the independent (2)evaluation required under this section. 17 18 The Department may use funds from the State Commission of (ii) 19 Real Estate Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors Fund to cover the cost of the independent evaluation. 20 21(d) The independent evaluation required under this section shall be: 22(1)completed for consideration by the committees of jurisdiction during the 23 2024 legislative session; and 24submitted by the Office of Program Evaluation and Government (2)Accountability to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Economic Matters 25Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on or before 26
