1 WHEREAS, The Holocaust, the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and
2 murder of European Jews by Nazi Germany and its collaborators, resulted in the murder
3 of six million Jewish men and women, including one and a half million children; and

4 WHEREAS, Millions of survivors of the Holocaust endured great suffering through
5 violence, torture, slave labor, and brutal medical experimentation; and

6 WHEREAS, Millions of others, including Roma, people with disabilities, LGBTQ
7 people, Jehovah's Witnesses, political dissidents, and more suffered and died because of
8 bigotry and hate; and

9 WHEREAS, Prejudice, bigotry, bias, and racism have been, and continue to be, the
10 cause of conflict, war, and mass atrocities; and

11 WHEREAS, Research shows that the tragedy that is the Holocaust is quickly being
12 forgotten, which will inevitably lead to an increased likelihood of ethnic cleansing, genocide,
13 terrorism, and crimes against humanity; and

14 WHEREAS, Social media has proven to be a platform for spreading misinformation,
15 lies, and hate; and

16 WHEREAS, Holocaust denial, the effort to minimize the historical reality and
17 barbarism of the Holocaust and the vast extent of death and carnage it caused, is becoming
18 commonplace; and

19 WHEREAS, Remembering the Holocaust offers an opportunity to study and reflect
20 on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments; and

21 WHEREAS, It is important to remember, honor, and emulate the righteous people,
22 including the Allied Forces, who risked their lives to save thousands of innocent people
23 during the Holocaust and to learn from their legacy of courage, selflessness, and hope; and

24 WHEREAS, January 27th is the date designated by the United Nations as
25 International Holocaust Remembrance Day; and

26 WHEREAS, The State of Israel, a democratic ally of the United States, has been a
27 safe haven for Jews fleeing the horrors of the Holocaust and persecution; now, therefore,

28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
29 That Section(s) 7-402 through 7-418 of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code
30 of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-403 through 7-419, respectively.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
32 as follows:

33 **Article – General Provisions**

1 **7-402.**

2 (A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM JANUARY 27 AS
3 MARYLAND HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY.

4 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL DECLARE MARYLAND HOLOCAUST
5 REMEMBRANCE DAY:

6 (1) A DAY OF REFLECTION, RECOLLECTION, AND DETERMINATION
7 FOR MARYLAND FAMILIES, EDUCATORS, RELIGIOUS COMMUNITIES, POLITICAL
8 BODIES, AND MEDIA TO REMEMBER THE HUMAN TRAGEDY THAT IS THE HOLOCAUST;
9 AND

10 (2) A PLEDGE TO SPREAD THE LESSONS AND THE REALITY OF THE
11 HOLOCAUST TO FUTURE GENERATIONS IN AN EFFORT TO ENSURE THAT WE NEVER
12 FORGET AND BEAR WITNESS TO THE MASS SLAUGHTER OF HUMAN BEINGS AS A
13 CONSEQUENCE OF PREJUDICE, BIGOTRY, IGNORANCE, AND HATE.

14 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2023.
