7 8 9	WHEREAS, The Holocaust, the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and murder of European Jews by Nazi Germany and its collaborators, resulted in the murder of six million Jewish men and women, including one and a half million children; and
10 11	WHEREAS, Millions of survivors of the Holocaust endured great suffering through violence, torture, slave labor, and brutal medical experimentation; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, Millions of others, including Roma, people with disabilities, LGBTQ people, Jehovah's Witnesses, political dissidents, and more suffered and died because of bigotry and hate; and
15 16	WHEREAS, Prejudice, bigotry, bias, and racism have been, and continue to be, the cause of conflict, war, and mass atrocities; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, Research shows that the tragedy that is the Holocaust is quickly being forgotten, which will inevitably lead to an increased likelihood of ethnic cleansing, genocide, terrorism, and crimes against humanity; and
20 21	WHEREAS, Social media has proven to be a platform for spreading misinformation, lies, and hate; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, Holocaust denial, the effort to minimize the historical reality and barbarism of the Holocaust and the vast extent of death and carnage it caused, is becoming commonplace; and
25 26	WHEREAS, Remembering the Holocaust offers an opportunity to study and reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, It is important to remember, honor, and emulate the righteous people, including the Allied Forces, who risked their lives to save thousands of innocent people during the Holocaust and to learn from their legacy of courage, selflessness, and hope; and
30 31	WHEREAS, January 27th is the date designated by the United Nations as International Holocaust Remembrance Day; and
32 33	WHEREAS, The State of Israel, a democratic ally of the United States, has been a safe haven for Jews fleeing the horrors of the Holocaust and persecution; now, therefore,

12 13 14 15	(1) A DAY OF REFLECTION, RECOLLECTION, AND DETERMINATION FOR MARYLAND FAMILIES, EDUCATORS, RELIGIOUS COMMUNITIES, POLITICAL BODIES, AND MEDIA TO REMEMBER THE HUMAN TRAGEDY THAT IS THE HOLOCAUST; AND
16 17 18	(2) A PLEDGE TO SPREAD THE LESSONS AND THE REALITY OF THE HOLOCAUST TO FUTURE GENERATIONS IN AN EFFORT TO ENSURE THAT WE NEVER FORGET AND BEAR WITNESS TO THE MASS SLAUGHTER OF HUMAN BEINGS AS A CONSEQUENCE OF PREJUDICE, BIGOTRY, IGNORANCE, AND HATE.
