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(b) The State Administrator shall:

- 18 (7) provided the State Board is fully constituted with five duly confirmed 19 members, be subject to removal by the affirmative vote of four duly confirmed members of 20 the State Board [for incompetence, misconduct, or other good cause except that:
- 21 (i) prior to removal, the State Board shall set forth written charges 22 stating the grounds for dismissal and afford the State Administrator notice and an ample 23 opportunity to be heard; and
