1 AN ACT concerning

Social Workers - Licensure Examinations - Moratorium Sunset Extension, Notification of Complete Application, and Workgroup on Social Worker Examination Requirements for Licensure

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of altering the licensure examination requirements for social workers: 6 requiring the Maryland Department of Health to establish a workgroup continuing 7 the State Board of Social Work Examiners in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to a certain date the 8 9 termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the 10 Board; requiring the Board, within certain time periods, to notify an applicant of 11 whether the application is complete; establishing the Workgroup on Social Worker Examination Requirements for Licensure to identify alternatives to examination 12 13requirements for a master social worker license, a certified social worker license, or 14 a certified social worker-clinical license and develop recommendations for a certain 15assessment method to replace a certain examination requirement; and generally relating to the State Board of Social Work Examiners and licensure examinations 16 for social workers. 17
