FOR the purpose of establishing the Baltimore Regional Transit Commission to review and
 approve comment on annual budget requests of the Maryland Transit
 Administration, updates to the Central Maryland Transportation Plan, and certain
 annual reports on the Administration's state of good repair, and to perform other
 oversight and advocacy duties related to Baltimore region transit services; and

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

12 (C) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL SELECT A CHAIR AND A VICE CHAIR 13 FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS.

14(2)THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR SHALL EACH SERVE A TERM OF 215YEARS IN THOSE CAPACITIES.

16 (D) (1) THE TERM OF A COMMISSIONER IS 3 YEARS.

17 (2) A COMMISSIONER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO 18 CONSECUTIVE TERMS.

19 (3) THE TERM OF A COMMISSIONER BEGINS JANUARY 1, 2024.

20(4) THE TERMS OF THE MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY21THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON JANUARY 1, 2024.

22 (5) AT THE END OF A TERM, A COMMISSIONER CONTINUES TO SERVE
 23 UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

24 (E) (1) THE BALTIMORE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL SHALL PROVIDE 25 STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION.

26(2) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR27OPERATIONAL EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE COMMISSION, INCLUDING FUNDING28FOR ONE SENIOR PLANNER AND TWO JUNIOR PLANNER STAFFING POSITIONS.

29 **(F) A** MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

1 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 2 COMMISSION; BUT

26 (5) (I) KEEP MINUTES OF COMMISSION MEETINGS AND MAINTAIN 27 PROPER RECORDS OF ALL COMMISSION ACTIVITY; AND

(II) POST ALL MINUTES, RECORDS, NOTICES, COMMENTS, OR
 OTHER INFORMATION ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION OR RECEIVED FROM THE PUBLIC
 ON A PUBLIC WEBSITE ESTABLISHED AND MAINTAINED BY THE COMMISSION;

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1 (6) EXERCISE OVERSIGHT OF PROVIDE INPUT AND ENGAGE IN 2 ADVOCACY FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEMS MAINTAINED 3 BY THE ADMINISTRATION;

4 (7) REVIEW ANY REPORT PREPARED BY OR FOR REQUEST AND REVIEW INFORMATION FROM THE ANNUAL ATTAINMENT REPORT AND THE $\mathbf{5}$ 6 ADMINISTRATION CONCERNING THE ATTAINMENT OF THE ADMINISTRATION'S GOALS, INCLUDING PERFORMANCE GOALS AND METRICS, EVALUATE ANY OTHER 7 MEASURES OF THE PERFORMANCE OF THE BALTIMORE REGION TRANSIT SYSTEM, 8 9 AND ISSUE WRITTEN RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING HOW THE RESULTS OF THE 10 **COMMISSION'S** REVIEW AND EVALUATION SHOULD INFLUENCE THE 11 **ADMINISTRATION'S PRIORITIES IN FUTURE YEARS;**

12 (8) REVIEW AND COMMENT ON TRANSPORTATION OPERATIONS, 13 PLANS, AND SERVICES PROPOSED FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION THAT 14 COMPLEMENT THE TRANSIT PLANS AND SERVICES OF THE ADMINISTRATION 15 SERVICE CHANGE REPORTS AND MAJOR SERVICE CHANGE PROPOSALS ON A 16 QUARTERLY BASIS;

17 (9) REVIEW AND APPROVE COMMENT ON THE ADMINISTRATION'S 18 ANNUAL OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET REQUEST FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION, 19 INCLUDING BUS, LIGHT RAIL, METRO, COMMUTER BUS, MARC SERVICE, AND 20 PARATRANSIT AS PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DRAFT AND FINAL 21 CONSOLIDATED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM;

(10) CONVENE SUBCOMMITTEES OR OTHER APPROPRIATE ENTITIES
 TO GATHER INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS FROM NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS,
 CIVIC FOUNDATIONS, EMPLOYERS, AND TRANSIT RIDERS REGARDING TRANSIT
 SERVICE IN THE BALTIMORE REGION;

26 (11) AS IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE, PROPOSE TO THE ADMINISTRATION
 27 AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY POLICIES THAT PROMOTE PUBLIC SAFETY,
 28 TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, CUSTOMER SERVICE, REGULAR
 29 COMMUNICATION WITH THE PUBLIC, AND PRUDENT FINANCIAL DECISION MAKING
 30 IN THE BALTIMORE REGION;

31 (12) REVIEW AND APPROVE ANY UPDATE TO THE CENTRAL 32 MARYLAND REGIONAL TRANSIT PLAN;

33 (13) SUBMIT FORMAL COMMENT ON THE CONSOLIDATED
 34 TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM;

35(14) (11)REVIEW AND APPROVE AN ANNUAL PLAN ON THE STATE OF36GOOD-REPAIR COMMENT ON THE CAPITAL NEEDS INVENTORY REPORT; AND

1 (15) (12) REVIEW LOCAL TRANSIT PLANS AND SERVICES IN THE 2 BALTIMORE REGION TO ENSURE COORDINATION BETWEEN THE LOCAL TRANSIT 3 SERVICES AND THE ADMINISTRATION.

4 **(H)** IN CARRYING OUT ITS DUTIES UNDER SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS COMMISSION SHALL $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION, THE ENDEAVOR ТО ENSURE THAT THE ADMINISTRATION'S PLANS, BUDGETS, DECISIONS, POLICIES, GOALS, PRIORITIES, 6 7 **OPERATIONS, AND SERVICES ADDRESS THE PUBLIC TRANSIT NEEDS OF RESIDENTS** AND BUSINESSES IN THE BALTIMORE REGION. 8

9 (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL 10 REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE BALTIMORE REGION 11 TRANSIT SYSTEMS TO THE ADMINISTRATION, THE GOVERNOR, AND, IN 12 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL 13 ASSEMBLY.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 7–213(d) 15 of the Transportation Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, the initial terms of the 16 members of the Baltimore Regional Transit Commission established under this Act shall 17 be staggered as follows:

(1) of the two three members from Baltimore City appointed by the Mayor,
one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and one member two members shall serve
an initial term of 3 years;

21 (2) of the <u>four three</u> members from Baltimore City appointed by the 22 Governor, <u>two members one member</u> shall serve an initial term of 4 years and two members 23 shall serve an initial term of 3 years;

(3) of the two members from Baltimore County appointed by the County
Executive of Baltimore County, one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and one
member shall serve an initial term of 3 years;

(4) of the <u>three two</u> members from Baltimore County appointed by the
Governor, one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and <u>two members one member</u>
shall serve an initial term of 3 years;

30 (5) the member from Anne Arundel County appointed by the County
 31 Executive of Anne Arundel County shall serve an initial term of 4 <u>3</u> years;

32 (6) the member from Anne Arundel County appointed by the Governor 33 shall serve an initial term of $\frac{3}{4}$ years;

34 (7) the member from Howard County appointed by the County Executive
 35 of Howard County shall serve an initial term of 4 years;

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1 (8) the member from Howard County appointed by the Governor shall 2 serve an initial term of 3 years; and

3 (9) the members of the General Assembly each shall serve an initial term 4 of 4 years; and

5 (10) the nonvoting member representing a labor union shall serve an initial 6 term of 3 years.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2023.
