Pharmacy Benefits Administration – Maryland Medical Assistance Program and
Pharmacy Benefits Managers

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the reimbursement levels for drug products that the Maryland 5 Medical Assistance Program is required to establish and that pharmacy benefits 6 managers that contract with a pharmacy on behalf of a managed care organization 7 are required to reimburse the pharmacy; altering the definition of "purchaser" for 8 purposes of certain provisions of law regulating pharmacy benefits managers to 9 include certain insurers, nonprofit health services plans, and health maintenance 10 organizations; and generally relating to pharmacy benefits administration.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 25
- 26 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
- been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 27
- 28 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 29 enacted.
