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URINE DRUG TEST FOR THE PRESENCE OF FENTANYL IF AN INDIVIDUAL IS TREATED
 AT A HOSPITAL AND THE HOSPITAL CONDUCTS A URINE DRUG SCREENING TO ASSIST
 IN DIAGNOSING THE INDIVIDUAL'S CONDITION, THE HOSPITAL SHALL INCLUDE
 TESTING FOR FENTANYL IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S URINE DRUG SCREENING.

5 (B) IF THE URINE DRUG SCREENING CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 6 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION DETECTS FENTANYL, THE HOSPITAL SHALL 7 REPORT THE TEST RESULTS, WHICH SHALL BE DEIDENTIFIED, TO THE DEPARTMENT 8 THROUGH THE STATE-DESIGNATED HEALTH INFORMATION EXCHANGE.

9 (B) (C) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A HOSPITAL THAT DOES NOT
 10 HAVE THE CAPABILITY OR EQUIPMENT TO CONDUCT A RAPID URINE DRUG TEST FOR

12 (C) (D) THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT ANY STATE LAW PROVIDING 13 CIVIL OR CRIMINAL IMMUNITY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS IN NEED OF MEDICAL 14 ASSISTANCE AFTER INGESTING OR USING ALCOHOL OR DRUGS, OR TO AN 15 INDIVIDUAL WHO IN GOOD FAITH ASSISTS ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL WHO IS IN NEED OF 16 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AFTER INGESTING OR USING ALCOHOL OR DRUGS.
