- 2. FOR A SECOND OFFENSE AND ANY SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE COMMITTED WITHIN A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS OF THE SECOND OFFENSE, A FINE OF \$1,000 FOR EACH OFFENSE.
- 10 (II) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS 11 PARAGRAPH, A RAILROAD COMPANY SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 12 ACTIONS OF ITS AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES IN VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION.
