- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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(d) (3) (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a Baltimore City
 school police officer whose permanent or temporary assignment is at a school or on school
 property [may] SHALL carry a firearm on the premises of the school to which the officer is
 assigned before or after regular school hours on school days and on days other than school
 days.
