10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Ann's Circle, Inc, DBA Annmarie Sculpture Garden and Arts Center (Annmarie) is committed to connecting people to art and nature. Through a wide variety of engaging exhibits, programs, classes, and annual events, we nurture the human spirit and contribute to an ever stronger and healthier society in the Southern Maryland region. Situated on 50 acres of lovely gardens with a 15,000 sq. ft. Arts Building, Annmarie blends world-class sculpture and tranquil natural vistas. As the largest community arts center in S. Maryland, Annmarie welcomes more than 85,000 guests annually to its galleries and grounds, popular festivals and events, art and nature education programs and family-friendly community activities. Equal emphasis is placed on both arts and nature programs for all ages in hopes of building a society that is kinder to each other and our planet.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Ann's Circle is seeking \$250,000 will be used to meet ADA compliance, provide much needed capital improvements for the Green House Project to expand current multigenerational nature programs, refurbish the Studio School to remove mold and maximize square footage to provide more public classroom space for adult and youth arts and wellness programs. The Greenhouse Project will serve as a collaborative center in our nature programs. The Calvert County Master Gardeners will work alongside our horticulturalist to engage and instruct youth from S. Maryland Home-school Association in planning, planting and harvesting a nutritional crop to be donated to the SMILE Food Pantry in Lusby, Maryland. Students from the tri-county district will have the opportunity to use our outdoor classroom space to learn environmental best practices. The Studio School project will provide much-needed additional indoor classroom space.

28. Comments

Demand for access to the garden and its programs has steadily increased in tandem with societys reexamination of the importance of addressing mental, physical and emotional health. Research has shown the vital connection between art, healing and, positive mental health impacts. This, plus the recent findings of the measurable benefits of being in nature, positions Annmarie Sculpture Garden & Arts Center as a vital resource for the health and well-being of the community.

Annmarie Garden has a history of growing and expanding in response to the needs of the community. Over the past 15 years, weve significantly increased family and intergenerational programming, developed a highly in-demand ceramics studio and, expanded our creative summer camps. In 2008, with help from a variety of allies, we constructed the only fine arts building in the region which is home to exhibition galleries, a childrens art lab, nature center.

From its inception, Annmarie Garden has been a public-private partnership. In 1991, the land was donated to Calvert County with love and affection by Francis and Ann Koenig. In addition, the Koenigs provided financial support and worked hand-in-hand with the local government to care for and develop the property. Today, Annmarie Garden is supported through private donations and sponsorships, earned income, and local/state grants.

The expansion of Annmarie Sculpture Garden & Arts Center would unquestionably have a positive impact on tourism and the economy of Southern Maryland which is a goal we pursue daily. But, most importantly, this effort will increase our ability to serve our treasured local community and the greater Maryland region.

Public access to St. Johns Creek/Chesapeake Bay including a new kayak/canoe launch Creation of a green parking area

Solar panel addition to the sprawling roof of current arts building
