<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)					

The Boonsborough Museum of History is a non-profit educational association created to organize, preserve, and make widely accessible the late Doug Bast's vast and unique collection of documents, artifacts, and images and to preserve, protect, and maintain the historic house museum and annex building within which these objects are displayed and stored.. We seek to expand the usefulness and meaning of the collection by joining with our community in the search for an understanding of what life was really like for the people who lived here before us through the living context of objects they left behind. The museum is operated by the Douglas G. Bast Museum of History and Preservation, Inc.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

This project is part of a plan to transform the Museum from a private collection into a wholly public institution. When fully completed, we expect the Museum to be a major tourism destination in Washington County, resulting in positive economic impacts on surrounding bed and breakfasts, hotels, inns, restaurants, retail stores, and historic sites. Specifically, we will:

1. Renovate and redesign the Annex second floor into space for a safe, accessible, and efficient community research library and meeting area where historians and families can benefit from curated access to the documents, photographs, and rare books of the collection.

2. Renovate and redesign the Annex first floor into a space suitable for our envisioned modern, accessible museum of interpretive displays featuring historical artifacts related to Abraham Lincoln, Native Americans, and early American clothing, family life, and farm life.

## 28. Comments

This request is a vital component of an overall plan to transform the Boonsborough Museum of History from a private collection into a public institution (as described in 11, above) and we have been actively planning and pursuing this vision for two years. The total cost of this effort is \$961,000 and we are well on our way to achieving our goals. We have launched the most urgent component of the plan: cataloging, curating and preserving the rare, fragile documents and artifacts in the collection. This is a long-term undertaking and work will go on into the foreseeable future with a cadre of trained volunteers. Software, training, consultant support, equipment and archival supplies are being secured with funding from multiple other sources.

The facilities of the Museum have not been adequately maintained over the years and we have developed a Master Plan for their restoration. Phase One involves implementing stabilization measures in the three-story Annex based on our structural engineers assessment. Improvements include: rehabilitation of exterior windows, upgrading of electrical service, installing temperature and humidity control systems appropriate for museum operations, reinforcing support beams and columns for 2nd and 3rd floors, and repointing and sealcoating much of the brick exterior. Some of these projects are completed and the remainder are about to be performed, These projects are funded with multiple other sources.

Phase Two of our plan (and the subject of this request), involves refining the structuraly and environmentally stabilized Annex building into spaces to accommodate the various activities and services to be housed there. Specifically:

1. Clean and restore ceilings, walls and floors in accord with MHT Historic Easement requirements

2. Build handicap accessible restrooms on 1st, 2nd and 3rd floors.

3. Install radiation shielding window coverings on all exterior windows to protect objects from damaging effects of outside light.

4. Replace inappropriate and inefficient lighting fixtures with lighting systems suitable for the various activities that will be conducted in the facility.

5. Install an elevator adequate for all museum needs, including transport of large items, furniture

6. Perform necessary modifications to ensure that all areas of the Museum are compliant with ADA standards.

When Phase Two is complete, we will commence with completing our vision and finishing out the Annex with interpretive displays featuring local history, research library and reading room, climate controlled curatorial laboratory, community meeting space for civic/interest groups to gather and storage areas for artifacts awaiting assessment and conservation.
