## 10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

CalvertHealth Medical Center (CHMC) has served the residents of Calvert County for more than 100 years. As the only hospital in Calvert County, its mission is to provide its residents and those who turn to CHMC with safe, high quality health care. Since 1989, the CalvertHealth Foundation (CHF) has been the catalyst that combines the needs of CHMC with the generous support from our community and supporters. Both organizations are 501(c) (3) entities governed by volunteers. As CHMC works to provide local residents with safe, high-quality health care, health data demonstrates a significant need for expanded oncology care options including a surgical robotics program for the Calvert community and state-of-theart resources for our talented team of surgeons. CHF is responding with a multi-million-dollar fundraising campaign.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Robotic surgery provides greater patient outcomes with smaller incisions and shorter recovery times. Currently, CalvertHealth Medical Center does not offer this service and therefore, surgeons must transfer patients out of the county to get these surgeries or perform non-robotic surgeries. CHMC is also located in a medically underserved area making recruitment for physicians and surgeons difficult. Year-over-year growth for surgeries performed by surgeons with a robot is more than 15% in Maryland. A recent survey of general surgery residency program administrators showed that 92% of programs have residents participate in robotic cases according to the NIH National Library of Medicine. Currently CalvertHealth has surgeons robotically trained on medical staff who could perform surgeries. Without a robot, CHMC would be at a continued disadvantage to recruit surgeons and to provide these services to our patients. CHMC is seeking immediate funding for a robotics program.

## 28. Comments

Project site for this application is the entire medical center and the number of people served includes CalvertHealth's primary service area which is defined as the population of Calvert County. It should

be noted that CalvertHealth Medical Center serves many outside its primary service area. In addition, a robotic surgical program is not available in county for those in Charles County. Those in these secondary areas would be able to refer to CalvertHealth Medical Center for those services.

Robotic surgery can be used to treat conditions affecting your heart, digestive system, bladder, prostate and more. CalvertHealth's surgeons would be able to treat their patients in the county with shorter length of stays in the hospital when current capacities at all hospitals are trending upward.

Benefits for robotic surgery include less blood loss, shorter hospital stays and quicker recovery.
