**10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

The JEWELS School is a creative and innovative private school and therapy clinic, devoted to enabling children with developmental disabilities to be educated alongside typically developing peers in their community. Children receive the academic, social, and life skills necessary to succeed in the future in a loving and supportive setting. JEWELS provides a strong academic program as well as a pediatric therapy center, enabling children with developmental disabilities and/or developmental delays to have all their educational and therapy needs met under one roof. Our staff is comprised of dedicated professionals who are passionate about helping all children. Our success is achieved through small classes, custom-tailored curricula, and typically developing peer models - all with our trademark love.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Hydro Therapy Center will provide clients with new state-of-the-art therapeutic features. Water increases mobility, so pool-based exercise helps people get and stay fit, or regain fitness, without joint damage. Aquatic therapy is particularly beneficial for children. Aquatic therapy makes the therapeutic experience less painful and more enjoyable for the child leading to a better all-around experience and outcome. When the hydrotherapy pool is operational, it will offer hydrotherapy sessions for the children enrolled in the JEWELS Inclusive school and many additional beneficiaries, including children, enrolled in other schools in the community, adults with special needs, and adults in the community seeking rehabilitative therapy (in the aftermath of surgery, injuries, and other needs). It is anticipated that the pool will be utilized daily throughout the year. It will be the first hydrotherapy pool in the area designed for pediatric care.
