The Project is to renovate and restore the historic Carriage House structure and construct an addition; the resulting building will provide three meeting spaces/classrooms, offices for the staff of theFriends group, visitor facilities such as restrooms, permanent and rotating educational exhibits in the new exhibit hall and serve as the hub for the educational programming offered by the Friends group (including summer camp for elementary schoolaged children). The project includes installing carefully designed storm water management facilities including a dry creek bed, a hugelkultur raised garden bed; native, conservation landscaping the adjacent area to provide both outdoor classroom and outdoor exhibits spaces, play spaces and interesting plants; and signage. All the walkways in the garden and the access road will display porous hardscaping, another storm water mitigation technique.
