Easterseals Delaware & Maryland's Eastern Shore is a nonprofit, community based health organization dedicated to increasing the independence of children and adults with disabilities through direct services and advocacy. We have been doing so for 75 years. Easterseals has served as an indispensable resource for exceptional services for children and adults with disabilities to have equal opportunities to live, learn, work, and play in their communities. Camp Fairlee has been offering recreation and respite services since 1954. Camp Fairlee is an accessible, residential camping program that serves as a much-needed source of recreation for children and adults with disabilities, and respite care for families in the Mid-Atlantic Region.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

Camping and swimming are synonymous with summer! At Camp Fairlee, these activities are accessible, beneficial, and fun for all ages and abilities. We have an emergency need to replace the 60-year-old swimming pool and mechanicals at Easterseals Camp Fairlee. The pool has required multiple repairs over the past 10 years due to its age. During the summer of 2022, the pool developed a leak of undetermined origin and loses approximately 8 inches of water weekly. To keep it operational in the summer, we incurred expenses of \$60,000 for water only. Unfortunately, to have an operational pool in 2023, we anticipate incurring water replacement costs of more than \$60,000, with the possibility of still having to close the swimming pool area due to the significant problems. As this is both a heavy financial burden and an environmental concern, Camp Fairlee is requesting Bond Bill funding to help support the dire need to demolish and replace the pool.
