28. Comments

Straddling Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties, Fairland Recreational Park is the only bi-county park of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. Of the 322 acres on Montgomery County side, only 39 acres are developed for active recreational uses. The park has an extensive paved and natural surface trail network and is quite popular with mountain bikers, equestrians, and hikers. The developed portion of the park has a wide variety of activities including athletic soccer fields (synthetic as well as natural turf), softball fields, and practice fields. Patrons can enjoy the tennis courts, basketball courts, an inline hockey court, playground, and picnic shelters.

The existing inline hockey court has fallen into disrepair is little used by park patrons, so renovation and repurposing of this court into a soccer court would greatly enhance the offerings to our users. This type of court is becoming increasingly popular throughout Montgomery County. Other infrastructure in the park such as the basketball courts and parking lot are aging and in need of renovation. Additionally, much of the project area predates the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The project will bring the facilities into ADA compliance as well as provide accessibility enhancements to the adjoining natural turf soccer field. The addition of dark sky compliant lighting to the courts, parking lot, and park entrance will expand our available hours of use to the community.

Our current budget does not allow us to make comprehensive renovations such as these as quickly as they are needed; this renovation project, especially the soccer court conversion and the addition of lighting, would greatly enhance the value of this park to the community it serves. With financial assistance from the State, this vital park will receive the upgraded renovations it deserves.
