("HFC") operates two engines, one engine tanker, a brush truck and other support vehicles in order to carry out our mission of saving lives and the property of those residing in or passing through the Hancock, Maryland area. The response area for HFC is Western Washington County, Maryland. The total first due area served is 61 square miles. HFC is always available for mutual aid to any nearby emergency services organization that requests it.

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Hancock Fire Company, Inc. (HFC) has signed a contract for the purchase of a new tanker. (We were able to do this as the result of a grant received from USDA Rural Development.) Our request would provide the equipment necessary for the unit to meet the standards required by the Washington County Volunteer Fire and Rescue Association. The second part of the project involves the purchase of a natural gas operated generator which would allow us to upgrade the size of our current generator. This is important for two reasons. First, the new one would enable HFC to fully utilize all electric in the fire house Second, natural gas would allow us to have an uninterrupted fuel supply during times of need for a generator,.
