10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Harford County 4-H Camp, established in 1925, is the oldest 4-H camp in Maryland and one of the oldest continuous use 4-H camps in the country. Managed by a volunteer Board of Directors, the camp's primary function is to support the community through providing various opportunities to enjoy the outdoors. Although the camp's property was originally donated for use by 4-H and the Harford County Youth, the camp does not receive funding from 4-H and thus relies on rent and usage from groups and individuals to remain open. The various opportunities opened to the public through the camp include youth club meetings, family reunions, sporting events, workshops, cannon balls into the pool, hiking, archery, singing songs around the campfire, learning about animals and plants that inhabit Harford County, and making lifelong friends.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

We serve families and youth from Harford County and beyond and want to share this hidden gem with others! Despite the best efforts of our camps volunteers to revitalize and sustain the facilities and grounds, the camps aging, primitive structures often aren't appealing to children who aren't used to the outdoors and often lack accessibility. For these reasons and so many others, we are requesting support in providing the necessary upgrades to the grounds. Through this support, we project an increase in revenue, which will not only be used to sustain and revitalize the grounds but will also help provide youth camping program scholarships for underprivileged youth. The future is bright at the Harford County 4-H Camp, and we can't wait to share this beautiful place with the thousands more families and youth in the years to come.
