<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)					

Established in 1979, Hospice of the Chesapeake (HOC) is a community-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with a mission of caring for life throughout the journey of life-limiting illness and loss. We are one of the largest nonprofit hospices/supportive care providers in the area, serving all living with or affected by advanced illness or loss, regardless of age, race, ethnicity, or inability to pay. For patients, families, and caregivers, we provide hospice and supportive care services in homes, residential facilities, and two Inpatient Care Centers across the organization, providing pain/symptom management, medical care, psychosocial, and spiritual support. Beyond hospice/supportive care, we offer family-centered services and grief care through the Chesapeake Life Center, pediatric care, child/teen camps, and year-round support through the Chesapeake Kids Program.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

After more than 30 years in the community, HOC continued to robustly meet community needs for hospice and supportive care as we purchased our first permanent facilities in 2012, where we remain headquartered today at 90 Ritchie Highway, Pasadena, Maryland. The campus of buildings, first built in the 1960s, HOC headquarters, Chesapeake Supportive Care (CSC) staff and education/training space, accounting and finance team, and the Rebecca Fortney Inpatient Care Center (RFICC). These spaces are identified as 90A (the property's largest structure), 90B, 90C, and 90D, respectively. 90A: roof replacement 90B: roof replacement, interior updates for education and training areas 90C: HVAC system updates/repairs 90D: furniture and fixture updates/renovations for patient rooms, family respite, and public areas; paint interior; upgrade nurses' station and medication room; increase staff room capacity. Upgrade property septic system.

## 28. Comments

Hospice of the Chesapeake respectfully requests bond bill funding in the amount of \$500,000 to support our overarching goal and mission to increase care and services to under-resourced, severely ill seniors, and their families and caregivers, in Anne Arundel County, Maryland.

Hospice care, by design, focuses on supporting families s they care for a loved one with an advanced illness. The majority of those served by HOC is seniors. Addressing the needs of the Anne Arundel County community brings increased comfort to the patient in mind, body, and spirit and supports family members in gaining coping skills and resilience. The quality of life for patients and their caregivers is improved, crucial as the county's 65+ population is projected to grow 10.2% or more through 2035. Hospice and supportive care ease the stress on all involved and avoid "care crises" as a patient's condition evolves, and adaptations are required. Bereavement care is a continuation of this family support as family members move through their grief after a loss.
