We are an open-admission shelter which means any lost, found, stray, injured, neglected, abandoned, or surrendered animal from our county in need of refuge, will not be turned away. We work alongside Salisbury City Animal Control and Wicomico County Animal Control to provide temporary shelter and care to stray animals in our area. As a non-profit organization, we are partially funded by the county and city of Salisbury for the services we provide. We rely on public support through donations, bequests, and fundraising events to raise the remaining amount of funds. We operate a full-time veterinary clinic and employ a full-time veterinarian. Within our clinic we perform 8-10 low cost and free spay/neuters a day for the public, as well as doing all medical treatment for our inhouse animals.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

Our shelter was built over 30 years ago and the population of our county was around 60,000. We currently have a population of 110,000. The shelter was originally designed as a "kill facility". We struggle daily with space issues, the inability to control disease, and the general decline of our building structure. The community does not want to support a "kill facility" and in the past 3 years we have increased our Live Release Rate from 56% to 86%. We receive overwhelming support from our community at this time. In our small 7,000 square foot shelter we are servicing our community with around 2,000 low-cost and free spay/neuters a year as well as providing medical services for all of our own animals. Our clinic is extremely small and poorly designed since it was never built to be a clinic. We implemented 1027 adoptions in 2022.
