10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)				
The organization is a municipal government responsible for the administration of the City of Gaithersburg, Maryland's third largest city with a population of approximately 70,000.				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

With the construction of Gaithersburg School #8, the City of Gaithersburg lost a field with lights at Kelley Park that had previously been used for internal programs and external rentals (primarily soccer and football use). The agreement between the City and MCPS at Kelly Park included the construction of a new turf field. In order to maximize the programming opportunities of the space the City will install field lighting. The City currently has three lighted natural grass fields and two lighted artificial turf fields on the west side of the City. Kelley Park is the only sports facility on the east side of the City. It currently consists of two, 90-foot baseball fields that the City permits out to one major user and a minor user. The artificial turf field at Kelley Park will be the only rectangular sports field for use on the east side of Gaithersburg where trends have shown the greatest interest is in soccer play and programs.

28. Comments				
Due to the nature of the artificial turf field, the City will have the ability to program and permit out use of the field twelve months of the year. These rentals cannot be accomplished without lights as the field use agreement with MCPS outlines City use starting at 5PM on weekdays. The City is currently engaged in a significant outreach program in coordination with both Gaithersburg and Forest Oak Middle School to increase participation in sports among teenagers (a national issue) and engage disconnected youth through sports. This outreach will increase the demand for use of rectangular field space, especially in the fall season when natural light is limited.
