Military & first responders & their families are eligible for membership discounts; OHRC also sponsors a swim team giving children an opportunity to swim competitively in the Prince-Mont Swim League; sponsors open houses, hosts day camps & offers swim lessons. OHRC hosts many family-style gatherings (birthdays, graduations, etc.) with the public welcome as member guests. Several local Boy Scout Troops use OHRC to earn their swimming/lifesaving/camping/volunteer badges.

The Oxon Hill Recreation Swim Club (OHRC) Board of Directors is seeking funds to renovate its 68-year-old swimming pool facility. With the requested 2023 funds our immediate priorities are to install holding tanks to temporarily contain pool water backwash, replace sand in filters/refurbish filter tanks, repair/replace non-functional underwater pool lights/upgrade associated electrical wiring and electrical panel, resurface pool deck. Also repair leak/re-plaster in/out take valve of baby/wade pool/replace motor. Upgrade/refurbish bathrooms. OHRC would also acquire an AED defibrillator. No new construction is planned with the funds. The renovations will not change the pool size.
