28. Comments

Rock Creek Regional Park is located in Rockville and serves a nearby Equity Focus Area of Montgomery County. Equity Focus Areas are places where residents may be experiencing disproportionate barriers due to a combination of demographic characteristics, including low income, racial minorities, and a population that speaks English less than well. Montgomery Parks is working to elevate the priority of capital projects that serve these areas.

This park stretches across approximately 1,800 acres and includes the beautiful 75-acre Lake Needwood and the 55-acre Lake Frank. The park was developed in the 1960s for lake-oriented recreation and flood control. It has three picnic areas with shelters, restrooms and playgrounds, a boat rental area, an archery range, hiking trails, and a maintenance yard.

Picnic Area 2 is one of the most popular destinations in the park, attracting large numbers of visitors. It is located in a highly visible area near the main park entrance but does not include a paved parking lot, ADA accessible routes to the picnic shelters, or playground for park patrons. The unpaved parking lot is frequently filled to capacity on weekends and in recent years, an outdated small playground that once existed in this area was demolished for safety reasons. The restroom building also requires renovations and ADA accessibility improvements.

Although this area has served the community well over the years, the amenities need to be improved to better meet the needs and expectations of visitors. The project will include an upgraded parking lot with greater capacity, a relocated and renovated volleyball court, a new playground to serve picnic area visitors, a fitness area, new site furnishings, improvements to the restroom building, improved ADA accessible paths to all the amenities, new stormwater management facilities, and landscape improvements.

Our current budget does not allow us to make comprehensive renovations such as these as quickly as they are needed, and this renovation project would introduce new facilities that would greatly enhance the value of this park to the community it serves. With financial assistance from the State, this vital regional park will receive the upgraded renovations it deserves.
