## **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

Thurmont Little League, established in 1952, is a non-profit organization operating under the rules and regulations of Little League International. The league is operated entirely by volunteers, including 100% volunteer umpires. The mission is to be the best Little League in the state of Maryland, providing children the best possible experience through participating in youth baseball and softball programs. Also, to grow and develop youth talents while fostering the Little League values of CHARACTER, COURAGE, & LOYALTY. Over 550 youth participants, 850 parents/guardians, and 500 or more other attendees are served at the league's facility annually. The league hosts tournaments and other activities that increase citizens served by more than 1,000. The local Babe Ruth Baseball organization is allowed use of the facility for their many players, coaches, and fans.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (	Limit length to visible area)
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Thurmont Little League was granted their property in 1969 from a local resident property owner. Three ballfields are in continuous operation with only one field having lighting, erected in approx. 1990 and inadequate as rcognized by current standards and safety gidelines. The league wishes to install new lighting on all three fields, allowing greater playing opportunities, safer playing conditions, and fewer suspended games due to darkness on weeknights. Very few local leagues own their fields. It is extremely difficult to raise the very high costs of lighting in todays market; thus, the league hopes to gain public funding support to light all three fields and save repeated construction costs and disruptions to the facility.

The current lighting was installed in approximately 1990 on one field only. It is costly to maintain an inadequate in function.

While the league receives very generous support from the local business community, in the form of team sponsorships and outfield signs, much of our registration income and donations are spent on uniforms and playing equipment at the begining of evach season. Facility upkeep, grounds maintenance, and insurances use most of any remainder in funding each year.

Thurmont Little League has never sought nor received any governmental funding. We have operated entirely on community support and player registrations since 1952.

It would be nearly impossible to generate the funding necessary for this project from the reliable contributions and registrations that are typical for the league. The league generates no substantial profit for use on capital improvements, in any given year.
