Chapter 504

(House Bill 794)

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore Regional Transit Commission - Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Baltimore Regional Transit Commission to review and approve comment on annual budget requests of the Maryland Transit Administration, updates to the Central Maryland Transportation Plan, and certain annual reports on the Administration's state of good repair, and to perform other oversight and advocacy duties related to Baltimore region transit services; and generally relating to the Baltimore Regional Transit Commission.

BY adding to

Article – Transportation Section 7–213 Annotated Code of Maryland (2020 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

7-213.

- (A) THERE IS A BALTIMORE REGIONAL TRANSIT COMMISSION.
- (B) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:
- (1) THE FOLLOWING SIX MEMBERS FROM BALTIMORE CITY, APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
- (I) $\overline{\text{Four}}$ $\underline{\text{Three}}$ members appointed by the Governor, including:
- 1. AT LEAST ONE MEMBER WHO USES TRANSIT IN THE BALTIMORE REGION; AND
- 2. AT LEAST ONE MEMBER FROM THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY; AND
- (II) $\overline{\text{TWO}}$ $\underline{\text{THREE}}$ MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR OF BALTIMORE CITY:

- (2) The following $\overline{\text{FIVE}}$ $\underline{\text{FOUR}}$ members from Baltimore County, appointed as follows:
- (I) $\overline{\text{THREE}}$ $\underline{\text{TWO}}$ MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, INCLUDING:
- 1. AT LEAST ONE MEMBER WHO USES TRANSIT IN THE BALTIMORE REGION; AND
- 2. AT LEAST ONE MEMBER FROM THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY; AND
- (II) TWO MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF BALTIMORE COUNTY;
- (3) THE FOLLOWING TWO MEMBERS FROM ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY, APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
 - (I) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR; AND
- (II) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY;
- (4) THE FOLLOWING TWO MEMBERS FROM HOWARD COUNTY, APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
 - (I) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR; AND
- (II) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF HOWARD COUNTY; AND
- (5) ONE NONVOTING MEMBER WHO IS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE ADMINISTRATION AND IS A MEMBER OF THE LARGEST LABOR UNION IN THE BALTIMORE REGION AMALGAMATED TRANSIT UNION LOCAL LABOR UNION, DESIGNATED BY THE LABOR UNION; AND
- (6) THE SECRETARY OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE, WHO SHALL VOTE ONLY IN THE CASE OF A TIE.
- (C) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL SELECT A CHAIR AND A VICE CHAIR FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS.

- (2) THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR SHALL EACH SERVE A TERM OF 2 YEARS IN THOSE CAPACITIES.
 - (D) (1) THE TERM OF A COMMISSIONER IS 3 YEARS.
- (2) A COMMISSIONER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.
 - (3) THE TERM OF A COMMISSIONER BEGINS JANUARY 1, 2024.
- (4) THE TERMS OF THE MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON JANUARY 1, 2024.
- (5) AT THE END OF A TERM, A COMMISSIONER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.
- (E) (1) THE BALTIMORE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION.
- (2) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR OPERATIONAL EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE COMMISSION, INCLUDING FUNDING FOR ONE SENIOR PLANNER AND TWO JUNIOR PLANNER STAFFING POSITIONS.
 - (F) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:
- (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION; BUT
- (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
 - (G) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- (1) ORGANIZE AND ESTABLISH POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE COMMISSION, INCLUDING CONFLICT OF INTEREST STANDARDS THAT PROHIBIT A COMMISSIONER FROM HAVING ANY INAPPROPRIATE FINANCIAL OR NONFINANCIAL INTEREST IN A MATTER OVER WHICH THE COMMISSION HAS JURISDICTION;
- (2) NOT LATER THAN 6 MONTHS AFTER THE COMMISSION FIRST MEETS, ADOPT BYLAWS TO GOVERN THE OPERATIONS OF THE COMMISSION;
 - (3) (I) MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY; AND

- (II) ACCEPT PUBLIC COMMENTS DURING THE MEETINGS AND, AT ALL TIMES, ELECTRONICALLY;
- (4) INCLUDE IN THE QUARTERLY AGENDA EACH OF THE FOLLOWING TOPICS AT LEAST ONCE EACH YEAR:
- (I) The State of Good Repair Capital Needs Inventory Report;
- (II) THE CONSOLIDATED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM PRIORITIES AND INITIAL BUDGET REQUESTS UNDER § 2-103.1 OF THIS ARTICLE; AND

(III) ANY BUDGET REQUEST APPROVAL; AND

- (IV) ANY UPDATE ON THE CENTRAL MARYLAND REGIONAL TRANSIT PLAN UNDER § 7–301.1 OF THIS TITLE;
- (5) (I) KEEP MINUTES OF COMMISSION MEETINGS AND MAINTAIN PROPER RECORDS OF ALL COMMISSION ACTIVITY; AND
- (II) POST ALL MINUTES, RECORDS, NOTICES, COMMENTS, OR OTHER INFORMATION ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION OR RECEIVED FROM THE PUBLIC ON A PUBLIC WEBSITE ESTABLISHED AND MAINTAINED BY THE COMMISSION;
- (6) EXERCISE OVERSIGHT OF PROVIDE INPUT AND ENGAGE IN ADVOCACY FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEMS MAINTAINED BY THE ADMINISTRATION;
- (7) REVIEW ANY REPORT PREPARED BY OR FOR REQUEST AND REVIEW INFORMATION FROM THE ANNUAL ATTAINMENT REPORT AND THE ADMINISTRATION CONCERNING THE ATTAINMENT OF THE ADMINISTRATION'S GOALS, INCLUDING PERFORMANCE GOALS AND METRICS, EVALUATE ANY OTHER MEASURES OF THE PERFORMANCE OF THE BALTIMORE REGION TRANSIT SYSTEM, AND ISSUE WRITTEN RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING HOW THE RESULTS OF THE COMMISSION'S REVIEW AND EVALUATION SHOULD INFLUENCE THE ADMINISTRATION'S PRIORITIES IN FUTURE YEARS;
- (8) REVIEW AND COMMENT ON TRANSPORTATION OPERATIONS, PLANS, AND SERVICES PROPOSED FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION THAT COMPLEMENT THE TRANSIT PLANS AND SERVICES OF THE ADMINISTRATION SERVICE CHANGE REPORTS AND MAJOR SERVICE CHANGE PROPOSALS ON A QUARTERLY BASIS;

- (9) REVIEW AND APPROVE COMMENT ON THE ADMINISTRATION'S ANNUAL OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET REQUEST FOR THE BALTIMORE REGION, INCLUDING BUS, LIGHT RAIL, METRO, COMMUTER BUS, MARC SERVICE, AND PARATRANSIT AS PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DRAFT AND FINAL CONSOLIDATED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM;
- (10) CONVENE SUBCOMMITTEES OR OTHER APPROPRIATE ENTITIES TO GATHER INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS FROM NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, CIVIC FOUNDATIONS, EMPLOYERS, AND TRANSIT RIDERS REGARDING TRANSIT SERVICE IN THE BALTIMORE REGION:
- (11) AS IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE, PROPOSE TO THE ADMINISTRATION AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY POLICIES THAT PROMOTE PUBLIC SAFETY, TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, CUSTOMER SERVICE, REGULAR COMMUNICATION WITH THE PUBLIC, AND PRUDENT FINANCIAL DECISION MAKING IN THE BALTIMORE REGION;
- (12) REVIEW AND APPROVE ANY UPDATE TO THE CENTRAL MARYLAND REGIONAL TRANSIT PLAN;
- (13) SUBMIT FORMAL COMMENT ON THE CONSOLIDATED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM;
- (14) (11) REVIEW AND APPROVE AN ANNUAL PLAN ON THE STATE OF GOOD REPAIR COMMENT ON THE CAPITAL NEEDS INVENTORY REPORT; AND
- (15) (12) REVIEW LOCAL TRANSIT PLANS AND SERVICES IN THE BALTIMORE REGION TO ENSURE COORDINATION BETWEEN THE LOCAL TRANSIT SERVICES AND THE ADMINISTRATION.
- (H) IN CARRYING OUT ITS DUTIES UNDER SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL ENDEAVOR TO ENSURE THAT THE ADMINISTRATION'S PLANS, BUDGETS, DECISIONS, POLICIES, GOALS, PRIORITIES, OPERATIONS, AND SERVICES ADDRESS THE PUBLIC TRANSIT NEEDS OF RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES IN THE BALTIMORE REGION.
- (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE BALTIMORE REGION TRANSIT SYSTEMS TO THE ADMINISTRATION, THE GOVERNOR, AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 7–213(d) of the Transportation Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, the initial terms of the members of the Baltimore Regional Transit Commission established under this Act shall be staggered as follows:

- (1) of the two three members from Baltimore City appointed by the Mayor, one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and one member two members shall serve an initial term of 3 years;
- (2) of the <u>four three</u> members from Baltimore City appointed by the Governor, <u>two members</u> one <u>member</u> shall serve an initial term of 4 years and two members shall serve an initial term of 3 years;
- (3) of the two members from Baltimore County appointed by the County Executive of Baltimore County, one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and one member shall serve an initial term of 3 years;
- (4) of the <u>three two</u> members from Baltimore County appointed by the Governor, one member shall serve an initial term of 4 years and <u>two members</u> one member shall serve an initial term of 3 years;
- (5) the member from Anne Arundel County appointed by the County Executive of Anne Arundel County shall serve an initial term of 4 3 years;
- (6) the member from Anne Arundel County appointed by the Governor shall serve an initial term of $\frac{3}{4}$ years;
- (7) the member from Howard County appointed by the County Executive of Howard County shall serve an initial term of 4 years;
- (8) the member from Howard County appointed by the Governor shall serve an initial term of 3 years; \underline{and}
- (9) the members of the General Assembly each shall serve an initial term of 4 years; and
- (10) the nonvoting member representing a labor union shall serve an initial term of 3 years.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
