House Bill 1111 Economic Matters (Delegates Phillips and Ebersole)

Finance

#### Baltimore County - Insurance - Certificates of Guarantee for County Bond Requirements

This bill authorizes, but does not require, Baltimore County to honor certificates of guarantee issued by a nonprofit association of contractors, or its wholly owned subsidiary in order to satisfy certain county bond requirements.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The Maryland Insurance Administration can enforce the bill's requirements using existing budgeted resources.

**Local Effect:** The bill authorizes, but does not require, Baltimore County to honor certificates of guarantee issued by a nonprofit association of contractors. Any impact on Baltimore County finances is expected to be minimal.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal.

#### Analysis

**Current Law:** A "certificate of guarantee" means an instrument that is issued on behalf of a contractor for the purpose of satisfying county bond requirements for public improvements or other county bond requirements. A "contractor" means a person that, for a fixed price, commission, fee, or percentage, undertakes to bid on or accepts or offers to accept orders or contracts to perform or supervise the construction, improvement, or maintenance of a building, structure, or road. Other counties that are authorized but are not required to honor certificates of guarantee include Calvert, Charles, Howard, Montgomery, Prince George's, St. Mary's, and Washington.

**Local Fiscal Effect:** Baltimore County does not anticipate the bill to materially affect local finances or operations, since the bill authorizes, but does not require, Baltimore County to honor certificates of guarantee issued by a nonprofit association of contractors.

Baltimore County further advises that the county still retains its ability to protect itself on specified projects where it favors performance bonds.
