### Maryland Holocaust Remembrance Day

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim January 27 as Maryland Holocaust Remembrance Day. The proclamation must declare the day (1) as a day of reflection, recollection, and determination for Maryland families, educators, religious communities, political bodies, and media to remember the human tragedy that is the Holocaust and (2) a pledge to spread the lessons and the reality of the Holocaust to future generations in an effort to ensure that we never forget and bear witness to the mass slaughter of human beings as a consequence of prejudice, bigotry, ignorance, and hate.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. Commemorating Maryland Holocaust Remembrance Day does not affect governmental finances.

#### Analysis

**Current Law:** Sixteen official commemorative days, seven months, and one week are recognized in State law, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.
