House Bill 566 Ways and Means (Delegate Ebersole)

State Lottery – Internet Sales of Subscription Plans – Authorization

This bill authorizes the State Lottery and Gaming Control Agency (SLGCA) to establish a system or program that allows for the purchase of a State lottery subscription plan through an electronic device that connects to the Internet, such as a personal computer or mobile device. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2023.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Minimal. The bill authorizes, but does not require, institution of Internet sales of State lottery subscription plans. Further, availability of Internet subscription plans is not expected to significantly increase subscription plan participation or overall sales of lottery tickets in the State.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: SLGCA may not allow the establishment of any system or program that allows a person to purchase a State lottery ticket through an electronic device that connects to the Internet, such as a personal computer or mobile device.

State Fiscal Effect: Subscription players do not currently represent a significant source of revenue for the State Lottery. While there could be an influx of additional subscribers should online subscriptions be allowed, it is not likely that the bill will significantly increase the overall lottery player base or State revenues.

Currently, a subscription player must print a State Lottery subscription application from the Lottery's website and mail the completed application to SLGCA, along with a check, for processing. Following review of the application and payment, SLGCA then activates the player's subscription, and the player receives an email that the subscription has been activated for the requested number of drawings. SLGCA anticipates that the institution of Internet-based subscriptions may alleviate some staff time and processing costs. However, implementation of Internet subscription plans would require software upgrades, with associated costs.
