## <u>AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 70</u> (Third Reading File Bill)

#### AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, before "**Change**" insert "<u>Major</u>"; in the same line, strike "**Impacts Report**" and substitute "<u>Publication on Website</u>"; strike beginning with "requiring" in line 3 down through "change" in line 7 and substitute "<u>altering the information that the Maryland Transit Administration is required to publish on its website before holding a public hearing on a major service change"; in line 8, strike "the report" and substitute "<u>a certain report on proposed major service changes</u>"; in the same line, strike "and entities"; in line 9, strike "service reductions or cancellations of" and substitute "<u>major service changes for</u>"; in line 17, strike "<u>7–715</u>" and substitute "<u>7–716</u>"; and after line 19, insert:</u>

"(As enacted by Chapters 583 and 584 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2023)".

#### AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 2 and 3, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 2 on page 2 through line 22 on page 3, inclusive, and substitute:

#### "<u>7–716.</u>

(a) Before announcing any service change that would constitute a major service change under the Federal Transit Administration's Title VI Requirements and Guidelines for Federal Transit Administration Recipients, the Department, in collaboration with the Administration, shall:

(1) Conduct a transit equity analysis in accordance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act and the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended to determine whether the change will create a disparate impact on persons with disabilities;

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(2) <u>Conduct a transit equity analysis in accordance with the Title VI</u> <u>Requirements and Guidelines for Federal Transit Administration Recipients to</u> <u>determine whether the change will create a disparate impact or a disproportionate</u> <u>burden;</u>

- (3) <u>Perform a cost-benefit analysis, including an analysis of impacts on:</u>
  - (i) <u>Economic development;</u>
  - (ii) <u>Employment;</u>
  - (iii) Education;
  - (iv) <u>Health; and</u>
  - (v) Environmental justice; and

(4) <u>Consult with members and leaders of affected communities,</u> including through community outreach to:

- (i) <u>Racial minority communities;</u>
- (ii) Low-income communities;
- (iii) Disabled riders;
- (iv) <u>Riders with limited English proficiency;</u>
- (v) <u>Transit–reliant riders; and</u>
- (vi) Senior riders.

(b) (1) If a transit equity analysis reveals disparate impact or disproportionate burden, the Administration shall:

(i) <u>Develop alternatives that would meet the goals of the</u> proposed service change; and

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(ii) Conduct a transit equity analysis on the alternatives.

(2) If a disparate impact can be avoided through use of one of the alternatives analyzed, the Administration shall proceed with that alternative as the primary proposed service change.

(3) If there is no alternative that would avoid a disparate impact or disproportionate burden, the Administration:

(i) May not implement the proposed service change unless a substantial justification exists that necessitates the change; and

(ii) Shall implement the alternative that causes the least disparate impact or disproportionate burden.

(c) Before holding a public hearing on a proposed service change, the Administration shall publish on the Administration's website WITH A VISIBLE LINK IDENTIFYING THE PROPOSED SERVICE CHANGE ON THE PRIMARY PAGE, for the routes [or lines], LINES, OR ANY CORRESPONDING PARATRANSIT SERVICE AREA impacted by the service change[, an evaluation on the demographics of:

- (1) The riders of the routes or lines; and
- (2) The service area]:

<u>5.</u> <u>Any community leaders consulted during the</u> <u>community outreach process; and</u>
